## A BILL

Making appropriations for certain Federal housing programs in the event of a Government shutdown.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Affordable Housing
- 5 Stability During Shutdowns Act of 2023".

1	SEC. 2. FUNDING FOR SECTION 8 RENTAL ASSISTANCE
2	VOUCHERS DURING GOVERNMENT SHUT-
3	DOWN.
4	There are hereby appropriated for fiscal year 2024,
5	out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appro-
6	priated, such sums as are necessary to provide assistance,
7	during the period of a lapse in discretionary appropria-
8	tions beginning on or after the date of the enactment of
9	this section and at a rate for operations and under the
10	terms and conditions provided for such assistance in fiscal
11	year 2023, under the following programs:
12	(1) The housing choice voucher program for
13	rental assistance under section 8(o) of the United
14	States Housing Act of 1937 (42 U.S.C. 1437f(o)),
15	including the program under paragraph (13) of such
16	section for project-based voucher assistance.
17	(2) The program for project-based rental assist-
18	ance under section 8 of such Act (42 U.S.C. 1437f).
19	(3) The program for assistance for supportive
20	housing for the elderly under section 202 of the
21	Housing Act of 1959 (12 U.S.C. 1701q).
22	(4) The program for assistance for supportive
23	housing for persons with disabilities under section
24	811 of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable
25	Housing Act (42 U.S.C. 8013).

1	(5) The program for rental assistance for rural
2	multifamily housing under title V of the Housing
3	Act of 1949 (42 U.S.C. 1471 et seq.).
