 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Providing Access to
Treatment and Housing Act of 2023" or the "PATH Act
of 2023".

1 SEC. 2. CENTER FOR UNHOUSED INDIVIDUALS.

2 Part B of title V of the Public Health Service Act
3 (42 U.S.C. 290bb et seq.) is amended by adding at the
4 end the following:

5 "Subpart 4—Center for Unhoused Individuals

6 "SEC. 5200. CENTER FOR UNHOUSED INDIVIDUALS.

7 "(a) IN GENERAL.—There is established in the Ad-8 ministration a Center for Unhoused Individuals (in this 9 section referred to as the 'Center') to lead Federal efforts to improve and expand access to mental and behavioral 10 health services for unhoused individuals. The Center shall 11 be headed by a director (in this section referred to as the 12 'Director') appointed by the Secretary from among indi-13 14 viduals with extensive experience or academic qualifications in the provision of mental and behavioral health serv-15 ices to unhoused individuals. 16

17 "(b) DUTIES.—The Director of the Center shall—

18 "(1) develop and promote policies that expand
19 access to mental and behavioral health services for
20 unhoused individuals;

"(2) develop and promote policies that support
housing services for unhoused individuals that have,
or likely have, at least one mental and behavioral
health condition;

25 "(3) facilitate coordination among—

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1	"(A) Federal, State, and local entities that
2	serve unhoused individuals; and
3	"(B) entities that provide mental and be-
4	havioral health services; and
5	"(4) provide technical assistance to entities re-
6	ceiving a grant under section 5200–1 regarding the
7	use of Federal funds to best support mental and be-
8	havioral health services for unhoused individuals.
9	"(c) Grants and Cooperative Agreements.—In
10	carrying out the duties under subsection (b), the Director
11	may make grants to and enter into contracts and coopera-
12	tive agreements with public and nonprofit private entities.
13	"(d) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
14	is authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
15	\$10,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2024 through 2029.
16	"SEC. 5200-1. MENTAL AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH RE-
17	SPONSE GRANTS FOR UNHOUSED INDIVID-
18	UALS.
19	"(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, in consultation
20	with the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development,
21	shall establish a grant program under which the Secretary
22	will award grants to eligible entities to improve mental and
23	behavioral health and housing services for unhoused indi-
24	

24 viduals, including through—

1	((1) the expansion and improvement of mental
2	and behavioral health services for unhoused individ-
3	uals; and
4	"(2) the expansion and improvement of housing
5	services for individuals experiencing, or likely experi-
6	encing, mental and behavioral health conditions.
7	"(b) ELIGIBILITY.—An entity is eligible to receive a
8	grant under this section if such entity is—
9	"(1) a State (as defined in section 534);
10	"(2) a municipality or other unit of local gov-
11	ernment; or
12	"(3) an Indian Tribe (as defined in section 4 of
13	the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assist-
14	ance Act).
15	"(c) USE OF FUNDS.—An entity may use funds re-
16	ceived through a grant under this section to increase ac-
17	cess to mental and behavioral health services for unhoused
18	individuals, including through—
19	((1) expanding access to evidence-based sub-
20	stance use disorder treatment and recovery activities
21	and services for unhoused individuals;
22	((2)) increasing access to medication-assisted
23	treatment for unhoused individuals who are also ex-
24	periencing opioid use disorder;

1	"(3) implementing and expanding harm reduc-
2	tion strategies and services through programs that
3	serve unhoused individuals;
4	"(4) reducing opioid and synthetic opioid or
5	fentanyl overdose deaths among unhoused individ-
6	uals;
7	"(5) implementing and expanding evidence-
8	based substance use disorder prevention strategies
9	among unhoused individuals;
10	"(6) expanding and increasing care coordina-
11	tion for unhoused individuals experiencing a mental
12	and behavioral health condition;
13	"(7) expanding access to and increasing the
14	number of health care professionals who treat
15	unhoused individuals experiencing at least one men-
16	tal and behavioral health condition;
17	"(8) establishing and expanding housing pro-
18	grams targeting unhoused individuals experiencing
19	mental and behavioral health conditions;
20	"(9) expanding access to mental and behavioral
21	health diagnostic services for unhoused individuals;
22	((10) supporting and expanding the mental and
23	behavioral health care workforce that treats
24	unhoused individuals; and

1	"(11) supporting and expanding evidence-based
2	mental health training for non-health care profes-
3	sionals that interface frequently with unhoused indi-
4	viduals, such as law enforcement personnel and first
5	responders.
6	"(d) Allocation.—
7	"(1) IN GENERAL.—Of the amount made avail-
8	able to carry out this section for a fiscal year, the
9	Secretary shall distribute a portion of such amount
10	to eligible entities selected to receive a grant under
11	this section on the basis of a formula developed by
12	the Secretary.
13	"(2) PRIORITIZATION.—The formula developed
14	by the Secretary under paragraph (1) shall prioritize
15	eligible entities located in regions that—
16	"(A) experience high rates of homelessness
17	and housing instability; and
18	"(B) experience above-average housing
19	costs.
20	"(e) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
21	is authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
22	\$2,000,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2024 through
23	2029.
24	"SEC. 5200–2. DEFINITIONS.
25	"In this subpart:

"(1) MENTAL AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH.—The
 term 'mental and behavioral health' means the
 health of an individual as it pertains to mental ill ness, drug abuse, alcohol abuse, and substance use
 disorders.

6 "(2) UNHOUSED INDIVIDUAL.—The term
7 'unhoused individual' has the meaning given the
8 term 'homeless individual' in section 103(a) of the
9 McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act.".
