A BILL

To direct the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency to conduct a study, and publish guidance on, calculating and reporting scope 3 emissions.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Standardized Calcula-
5 tion of Operational Polluting Emissions Act” or the
6 “SCOPE Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. STUDY AND GUIDANCE ON SCOPE 3 EMISSIONS.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 12 months after
3 the date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of
4 the Environmental Protection Agency shall conduct a
5 study, and publish guidance, on calculating and reporting,
6 for direct emitters, scope 3 emissions above thresholds the
7 Administrator determines appropriate.

8 (b) INCLUSIONS.—The guidance published under
9 subsection (a) shall include—

10 (1) thresholds of scope 3 emissions above which
11 reporting to the Environmental Protection Agency is
12 recommended;

13 (2) calculation methodologies for scope 3 emis-
14 sions based on source categories;

15 (3) recommendations on frequency of moni-
16 toring scope 3 emissions;

17 (4) quality assurance and control guidance for
18 scope 3 emissions data;

19 (5) methodologies for estimating missing scope
20 3 emissions data; and

21 (6) guidance for record keeping for scope 3
22 emissions data and reporting of such data.

23 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

24 (1) DIRECT EMITTER.—The term “direct emit-
25 ter” means—

26 (A) a facility—

1 (i) that is in one of the source cat-
2 egories defined in subpart C through sub-
3 part JJ of part 98 of title 40, Code of
4 Federal Regulations (or successor regula-
5 tions); and

6 (ii) with respect to which the green-
7 house gas reporting requirements and re-
8 lated monitoring, recordkeeping, and re-
9 porting requirements of such part 98,
10 apply; or

11 (B) any other facility the Administrator of
12 the Environmental Protection Agency deter-
13 mines appropriate.

14 (2) GREENHOUSE GAS.—The term “greenhouse
15 gas” means the air pollutants (as defined in section
16 302(g) of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7602(g))
17 carbon dioxide, hydrofluorocarbons, methane, nitrous
18 oxide, perfluorocarbons, and sulfur hexafluoride.

19 (3) SCOPE 3 EMISSIONS.—The term “scope 3
20 emissions” means indirect greenhouse gas emissions
21 resulting from upstream and downstream value
22 chain activities, as determined by the Administrator
23 of the Environmental Protection Agency.

1 (d) CONGRESSIONAL INTENT.—Nothing in this sec-
2 tion may be construed to affect the authority of the Presi-
3 dent, any Federal agency, or any State under existing law.
